Alive at 25 is a young driver intervention program that zeros in on drivers between the ages of 15 and 24, the group most likely to be involved in a fatal collision. Alive at 25 focuses on the attitudes, behaviors, and decision-making paradigms that lead to the increased risk for these collisions.

Since the program was brought to South Carolina in 2007, we have seen a continual decline in fatalities within this age group.

Alive at 25 is a collaborative effort between the South Carolina National Safety Council, local Law Enforcement Agencies, school administrators, and community members. The success of the program is dependent on all of these entities working towards a common goal.




