## Overview

Gain a better understanding of the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act and how millions in funding to South Carolina schools can help your students. The federal government is in the process of rolling out billions in federal coronavirus aid for schools that Congress approved last month. About \$13.5 billion nationally (more than \$200 million for South Carolina) will be distributed to school districts using the existing Title I formula focused on disadvantaged students, and there is a \$3 billion fund for governors nationally to distribute to both K12 and higher education.
