NAEP 2022 Long-Term Trends Highlights Report

*National Center for Education Statistics (*September, 2022) In 2022, the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) conducted a special administration of the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) long-term trend (LTT) reading and mathematics assessments for age 9 students to examine student achievement during the COVID-19 pandemic. Average scores for age 9 students in 2022 declined 5 points in reading and 7 points in mathematics compared to 2020. This is the largest average score decline in reading since 1990, and the first ever score decline in mathematics.

TEACHER-PRINCIPAL TRAINING AND RECRUITMENT BIDEN ADMIN ANNOUNCES ACTIONS TO STRENGHTEN TEACHING PROFESSION

Leading talent recruitment and job platforms, such as ZipRecruiter, Handshake and Indeed, are announcing a series of new actions to make it easier for states and school districts to source, recruit, and hire job seeking teachers and school professionals. In addition, national organizations representing teachers, state school chiefs, governors, and teacher colleges announced that they are working together to expand high-quality registered teacher apprenticeship programs, teaching residencies, and Grow Your Own programs.
